The jurisdiction of this Court has been invoked under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus seeking direction to respondents No.1 to 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of respondents No.4 to 9.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Jasjit Singh Rattu, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State, who has produced a speaking order passed by SHO, Police Station Badali Ala Singh, District Fatehgarh Sahib.

Mr. Vishal Sharda, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of respondent No.5 and has filed Power of Attorney, which is taken on record.

As per the speaking order, the statement of petitioner No.1 has been recorded to the effect that now she and Manpreet Singh-petitioner No.2 have no danger to their life and liberty from their family and also, statement

of respondent No.7 has been recorded to the effect that they have no objection to the live-in-relationship of petitioner No.1 with petitioner No.2 and his entire family has severed all ties with petitioner No.1, Dilpreet Kaur. A copy of the speaking order has been furnished to learned counsel for the petitioners.

In light of the above, learned counsel for the petitioners does not want to press the instant petition any further and prays for withdrawal of the same.

Prayer is accepted.

The present petition stands dismissed as withdrawn.

However, the petitioners would be at liberty to file appeal, as is stipulated in the Standard Operating Procedure as per law, in case of any grievance left after passing of the speaking order.
