HARKESH MANUJA J. (Oral)

1. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner shall furnish his bank details along with an indemnity bond as well as an affidavit from his sister for receipt of dues of their deceased-father and the needful shall be done within one week from today.
2. In response, learned counsel for the respondents, on instructions, submits that upon receipt of the indemnity bond towards securing the claim of the sister of the petitioner in future, the dues shall be released within reasonable phased manner/installment, with first installment to be released within 15 days of the receipt of documents from the petitioner.
3. In view thereof, no further orders are required to be passed in the present petition, as such, the same is disposed of. Rule stands discharged.
4. However, in case the needful is not done, as per undertaking,

the petitioner would be at liberty to seek revival of the present contempt petition and in that eventuality, the erring /concerned officer(s) would be liable to pay additional sum of Rs.50,000/- as costs from his/her own pocket in favour of the petitioner towards litigation expenses, immediately, i.e. on the first date of listing of revival application, if any.

5. Pending miscellaneous application, if any, shall also stands disposed of.
