On 28.07.2025 the following order was passed:-

“ The prayer in the present petition under Section 528 of BNSS, 2023 is for quashing and setting aside of the impugned order dated 16.07.2025 (Annexure P-4) passed by the learned Judge Special Court, Kapurthala in case no.NDPS-83-2024 titled as State of Punjab Vs. Avtar Singh @ Nonu etc in FIR No.0050 dated 12.07.2023 registered at Police Station Fattundhinga, District Kapurthala under Section 22/29/25/31 of the NDPS Act wherein bail bonds and surety bonds of the petitioners have been cancelled and forfeited to the State and NBWs of arrest have been issued.

The learned counsel for the petitioners contend that on account of their appearance in another court, the petitioners were unable to appear on 16.07.2025 because of which impugned order came to be passed. She states that they are ready and willing to join proceedings once again.

In the meanwhile, the petitioners are directed to surrender before the Trial Court within a period of one week from today and subject to a deposit of Rs.25,000/- as costs with the Society for the Care of the Blind, Sector 26, Chandigarh Account No.10506615304, IFSC Code SBIN0003246 State Bank of India, Sector 7, Chandigarh being run by Chandigarh Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes & Minorities Financial & Development Corporation, they shall be admitted to interim bail to the satisfaction of the Trial Court.

The petitioners are directed to produce the copy of the order granting him bail on the next date of hearing.”

The Counsel for the petitioner contends that in compliance of the aforementioned order the petitioners have surrendered and have since been granted the concession of interim bail. They have also deposited the costs as imposed by this Court vide order dated 28.07.2025.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court.

Disposed of.

However, it is made clear that the petitioners shall continue to appear before the Trial Court and shall not absent themselves without any sufficient cause.
