1. The instant writ petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing of the orders/instructions dated 21.02.2025 (Annexure P-1) and 28.02.2025 (Annexure P-2) passed by respondents whereby clarification has been sought as to whether the workers wish to continue in service as MDM worker or Panchayat Member.

2. A perusal of the above mentioned instructions/orders shows that no adverse order has been passed against the petitioners, rather only a clarification has been sought. It has been mentioned in the said orders/instructions that a notice will be served upon the said worker and the reply thereof will be received within a period of one month.

3. After arguing for some time, learned counsel for the petitioners, on instructions from the petitioners, submits that the petitioners would be satisfied, if a direction may be issued to respondent No.2 to decide the legal

notice dated 27.02.2025 (Annexure P-4) expeditiously, served by the petitioners to the respondents.

4. Without commenting upon the merits of the case, respondent No.2 is directed to decide the legal notice dated 27.02.2025 (Annexure P-4) send by the petitioners, within a period of 02 months from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order.

5. In view of the above terms, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
