SHEEL NAGU, CHIEF JUSTICE (Oral)

1. Challenge in this petition essentially is to show cause notices dated 13.03.2025 (Annexure P-1) and 11.04.2025, which has been brought on record by way of CM-6050-CWP-2025.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that sons of the petitioner being accused in an offence punishable under the Narcotic Drugs & Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 (NDPS Act), notices for demolition of residential house of the petitioner have been served upon the petitioner.

3. After having gone through the show cause notices, which are under challenge, it is obvious that there is no mention of any provision of NDPS Act and, therefore, it appears that the matter essentially relates to Municipal Corporation, Jalandhar, under whose jurisdiction the alleged



construction has been raised against the norms prescribed under the Punjab Municipal Corporation Act, 1976.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is owner and in possession of the disputed property since the year 1954. Be that be so, the petitioner is free to approach the Civil Court/competent judicial authority, since this Court cannot decide the issue of title and possession of the disputed property.

5. With the aforesaid liberty, without commenting on the merits of the case, the petition stands disposed of.

6. Pending application also stands disposed of.
