JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India is seeking setting aside of order dated 11.02.2025 whereby he has been sent back to his parent department from Vigilance Bureau.

2. The petitioner claims that he is posted with Vigilance Bureau at Bathinda and by impugned order has been repatriated to his parent department. He belongs to Ludhiana Commissionerate, thus, he is supposed to report to Commissioner, Ludhiana. The petitioner is facing family problem. He has old aged parents and his father has recently suffered bullet injury. He has two minor children and one of them is going to school. He needs some time to settle his family affairs so that he may join at Ludhiana.

3. Mr. Aman Dhir, who on advance notice is present in Court, submits that petitioner has been repatriated to his parent department. He cannot claim his stay with Vigilance Bureau.

4. The petition stands disposed of with a direction to competent authority to consider petitioner for granting breathing period which may be from 6 weeks to 8 weeks.
