Prayer in this petition is for initiation of contempt proceedings against the respondent(s) for not complying the order dated 05.5.2025 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-11281-2025 titled as "Sadhu Singh Gill and another vs. State of Punjab and others" vide which the petition was disposed of with a direction "*...to respondent No.2 to treat the present writ petition as a representation and decide the same within a period of 08 weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order, by passing a speaking order, in accordance with law.*"

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that in compliance of directions of order dated 05.5.2025



(Annexure P-1), consolidated order dated 24.7.2025 has been passed by the Registrar, Cooperative Societies, Punjab. It is submitted that in particular the case of the petitioners has not been dealt with and prays that he may be permitted to challenge the same in accordance with law.

Learned counsel for the respondent-State submits that necessary compliance has been made, while passing the order dated 24.7.2025 by the respondent-authority; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

Copy of the aforesaid order dated 24.7.2025 produced by the learned counsel for the respondent-State is taken on record. Copy thereof is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioners. Registry to tag/paginate the same at appropriate place in the paper-book.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed in the present petition, the same is **disposed of** accordingly.

However, the petitioners would be at liberty to challenge the aforesaid Order dated 24.7.2025 as per law.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
