1. In the present petition, the grievance being raised by the petitioner is that the petitioner is in transport business and has three regular stage carriage permits on the rural link roads and is operating his buses as detailed in paragraph No.3 of the petition but the timetable is not suitable to him and he has already filed the legal notice for rescheduling of the timetable.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has already raised the said grievance in the legal notice/representation dated 15.04.2025 (Annexure P-9), which is still pending consideration with the respondents and the petitioner will be satisfied, at this stage, in case a direction is issued to the respondents to decide the same by passing an appropriate speaking order in a time bound manner.

3. Notice of motion.

4. On the asking of the Court, Mr. T.P.S. Chawla, Senior Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State and submits that in case, legal notice/representation dated 15.04.2025 (Annexure P-9) has been received in the office of the



concerned authorities and the same is still pending consideration with the authorities concerned, the same will be decided by the competent authority keeping in view the settled principle of law within a period of eight weeks from the date of the receipt of certified copy of this order by passing an appropriate speaking order. In case, it is found feasible to accept the claim of the petitioner, the same will be accepted, otherwise due reasons for not accepting the claim of the petitioner will be mentioned in the speaking order so passed which order will be conveyed to the petitioner for his information and necessary action.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that keeping in view the statement of learned counsel for the respondents, the present petition may kindly be disposed of having been not pressed any further.

6. Ordered accordingly.
