Prayer in this 2nd petition filed under Section 483 of BNSS, 2023, is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in FIR No.49 dated 06.05.2018 registered under Sections 18, 21, 23, 29 of the NDPS Act at Police Station Mamdot, District Ferozepur. First petition was dismissed as withdrawn on 05.11.2024.

Custody Certificate dated 20.02.2025, has been filed in the Court today, which is taken on record.

Learned State counsel, at the very outset, submits that the petitioner remained absconding and she was declared proclaimed offender and is involved in one more case, registered under the NDPS Act, in which she is not on bail and she has been convicted in another case registered under the NDPS Act on 18.02.2025, however, learned State counsel could not controvert the fact that the petitioner is behind the bars since for the last 01 year, 09 months and 8 days and the FIR (supra) has been registered on 06.05.2018.



Learned counsel for the petitioner wishes to withdraw the present petition.

Dismissed as withdrawn.

However, considering the fact that the petitioner is behind the bars since from the last 01 year, 09 months and 08 days, the Senior Superintendent of Police, Ferozpur, is directed to ensure that all the official witnesses shall appear before the learned trial Court on the next date of hearing, for recording their depositions.

The learned trial Court is also directed to take appropriate steps to procure the presence of the prosecution witnesses and conclude the trial expeditiously preferably within a period of 04 months from today.
