**AMARJOT BHATTI, J.(Oral)**

1. Petitioner Abhishek Goyal has filed petition under Section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 02 dated 09.01.2025 under Section 406, 498-A of IPC registered at Police Station PS Women, District Police Commissionerate, Ludhiana.
2. Brief facts of the case are, complainant Deepak Goyal filed written complaint alleging that marriage of his daughter Mehak Goyal was performed with Abhishek Goyal on 07.07.2018. He had spent Rs. 30 lacs on marriage of his daughter. His daughter was earlier married with Sanjeev Kalra and out of this wedlock, she was having a daughter. After the death of her husband, she was residing in parental house. His daughter was doing



job in IELTS institute where she came in contact with Abhishek Goyal. Talk regarding marriage started and finally marriage was performed with great pomp and show. He had fulfilled all illegal demands under compelled circumstances. He has narrated various events and incidents which took place in matrimonial home. His daughter was ill-treated by her husband at the instance of other co-accused. There was continuous dispute between husband and wife who used to consume liquor and other drugs and even gave her beating. They used to taunt her for bringing less dowry. Finally, matter was reported to police.

3. Learned counsel for petitioner pointed out that matter was referred to Mediation and Conciliation Centre and they have settled their dispute vide settlement/agreement dated 29.05.2025. Petitioner will abide by terms and conditions settled before Mediation and Conciliation Centre.

4. Learned counsel representing respondent Nos. 2 and 3 confirmed aforesaid compromise and did not oppose anticipatory bail petition.

5. Learned counsel representing State of Punjab also filed status report and in view of compromise did not oppose anticipatory bail petition.

6. Considering the aforesaid factual position, no purpose would be served by sending the petitioner behind the bars. Therefore, anticipatory bail petition filed by petitioner Abhishek Goyal is allowed. He be not arrested. In case of his arrest, he be released on bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer concerned, subject to condition that petitioner will join investigation as and when required. He will not tamper

with or interfere with investigation and will not leave country without prior permission as provided under Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023.
