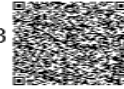
**MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J.**

Present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution for issuance of necessary directions to respondent Nos. 1 to 5 to take appropriate steps to ensure the protection of life and liberty of petitioner from the hands of private respondent Nos. 6 to 8.

(2) Status report dated 08.01.2025 by way of affidavit of Mr. Jasjyot Singh, PPS, DSP, Jagraon, District Ludhiana (Rural) has been filed on behalf of respondent No.3, which is taken on record. Copy supplied to other other side. Registry to tag the same at appropriate place.

(3) For reference, Para No. 6 of the aforesaid affidavit is extracted as under:-

*“6. That the SSP Ludhiana (Rural) marked this application to SP (D) Ludhiana (Rural) for enquiry. The SP (D) Ludhiana (Rural) has conducted enquiry and submitted his enquiry report dated 28.11.2024. The enquiry report reveals that the petitioner is resident of village Mehron which falls in the jurisdiction of PS Mehna, District Moga. If the petitioner has any apprehension of thereat perception from the private*



*respondents then he can approach the police of PS Mehna and get necessary action done from that police station. The enquiry officer recommended that no further action is required to be taken on this application and the same may be consigned. The SSP Ludhiana (Rural) has approved this enquiry report vide order dated 29.11.2024.”*

(4) Perusal of the above extract clearly reveals that as on today, there is no threat to the life and liberty of petitioner.

(5) In view of the above, no further directions are required to be issued in the matter “at this stage”.

(6) Disposed off accordingly.

(7) Needless to say that in case, if the occasion so arises, petitioner would be at liberty to take recourse to the remedy available under law.

Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
