The petitioner is challenging the order dated 04.03.2025 as passed by the Court of learned Judge, Special Court, Amritsar in CIS No.954 of 2019 whereby his bail had been cancelled and bail bonds were forfeited to the State and warrants of arrest were ordered to be issued against him.

2. It is argued by learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is ready to join the proceedings before the trial Court and to abide by the terms and conditions to be imposed upon him, therefore, it is urged that the instant petition be allowed and order dated 04.03.2025 be set aside.

3. Though, this Court is of the considered opinion that there is no illegality or infirmity in the order dated 04.03.2025 it was on account of his ill-health, he could not appear before the trial Court as he was advised medical rest.



In view of the request made by learned counsel for the petitioner at this stage to grant the petitioner one opportunity to surrender before the trial Court and further keeping in view the fact that the absence of the petitioner does not attract the consequences of detaining him into custody as he is willing to join the trial and the ultimate aim is to ensure timely disposal of the cases before the learned trial Court, as such, the present petition is *disposed of* with a direction to the petitioner to surrender before the learned trial Court /Duty Judge/Illaq Magistrate within two weeks from today and it is further ordered that on his surrender and on moving appropriate application, the learned trial Court admit him to bail subject to his furnishing personal as well as surety bonds to its satisfaction. However, his arrest shall remain stayed during the interregnum and this petition shall be deemed to be dismissed if the petitioner does not abide by this order.

4. A copy of this order be sent to the learned trial Court.
