**ASHUTOSH MOHUNTA, ACJ. (Oral)**

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner as well as the respondents have already nominated their Arbitrators but the Arbitrators so appointed have failed in appointing an Umpire.

The petitioner has prayed that an Umpire be appointed in this case to settle the dispute between the parties.

Counsel for the respondent has no objection to the appointment of an Umpire by the Court. He, however, submits that fee of the Umpire should be as per the schedule of the respondent-Corporation.

After hearing counsel for the parties, I appoint Justice R.S. Mongia, Retired Chief Justice (# 119, Sector 10, Chandigarh), as an Umpire to adjudicate the disputes between the parties along with the two Arbitrators under the aegis of the Chandigarh Arbitration Centre, Sector-17, Chandigarh.

The fee of the Empire shall be governed by the Chandigarh Arbitration Centre (CAC) (Administrative Cost and Arbitrator's Fees) Rules, 2014.

The petition accordingly stands disposed of.
