**AMARJOT BHATTI, J.**

1. Petitioner has filed instant petition for quashing of impugned order dated 14.01.2025 (Annexure P-6) passed by learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Sirsa (Annexure P-1) vide which bail order of petitioner was cancelled, his bail bonds and surety bonds were forfeited to State and his non-bailable warrants have been issued.

2. Learned counsel for petitioner argued that petitioner was regularly appearing before the trial Court. On the date fixed i.e. 14.01.2025 on account of official work, he was to go to Bombay, therefore, he requested the counsel to file application (Annexure P-5) seeking exemption of personal appearance. Said application was declined without any valid justification and his arrest warrants were issued vide impugned order dated 14.01.2025 for 11.03.2025. Petitioner was facing trial and there was no intention on his part to delay the proceedings. In future, petitioner will regularly face the trial and in case there is any unavoidable circumstance then he will file prior application seeking exemption of his personal appearance.

3. On advance notice, Ms. Ambika Sood, Addl. A.G, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of State. Factual position is not disputed.

4. I have considered the arguments and have gone through the record. Perusal of impugned order shows that, apart from the present petitioner, there are other co-accused who are also facing trial. On every date, application is filed by one accused or the other, as a result, proceedings in the trial Court are adversely effected. In the case in hand, present petitioner filed application seeking exemption from personal appearance, the same was declined. As referred above, petitioner is ready to abide by the terms imposed on him for his appearance before the trial Court. It is already stated that Gulpavitar Singh will regularly face the trial before the trial Court and in case there is unavoidable circumstance, then he would file prior application seeking exemption of his personal appearance, otherwise he will not miss any date. Therefore, taking a lenient view impugned order dated 14.01.2025 (Annexure P-6) is accordingly set aside with the direction to petitioner to surrender before the trial Court within 7 days from today and be released on bail to the satisfaction of trial Court subject to the deposit of Rs.20,000/- with High Court Legal Services Committee.

5. Petition is accordingly disposed of.

6. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, stand disposed of accordingly as well.
