HARPREET KAUR JEEWAN, J. (ORAL)

1. By way of filing the instant petition, violation of the judgment dated 09.04.2024, passed by this Court in LPA-1326-2023 (Annexure P-1), has been alleged, whereby, following directions were issued:-

“xxx xxx xxx xxx

22. Thus, keeping in view the above said principle and the claim for work for 8 years as per the certificate dated 15.03.1996 and the admission regarding a period of 6 years, we are of the considered opinion that a sum of Rs.3,50,000/- would be adequate compensation for the conflicting claims of the period of employment. Resultantly, the State shall pay a sum of Rs.3,50,000/- to the appellant by way of bank draft within a period of 2 months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the judgment.”

2. Mr. Sharad Aggarwal, Addl. A.G., Haryana, on instructions from Mr. Vishal Kaushik, Divisional Forest Officer, Division Morni, Panchkula, who is present in the Court today, informs that the sanction for



payment of the said amount has been received from the Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana. Copy of the order dated 13.10.2025, passed by the Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana, has been submitted in the Court today, which is taken on record.

2.1 Mr. Vishal Kaushik, Divisional Forest Officer undertakes that the said amount shall be released to the petitioner within a period of 03 weeks from today.

3. In view of the above undertaking, the present petition stands disposed of. However, the undertaking given in the Court today be adhered to, failing which, the petitioner shall be at liberty to file an application for revival of the present petition, if so advised.

4. Pending miscellaneous applications, if any, shall stand disposed of.
