NAMIT KUMAR, J. (ORAL)

1. The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking quashing of impugned order dated 28.10.2013 (Annexure P-3) passed by the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Kapurthala, whereby proclamation under Section 82 Cr.P.C. was issued and the petitioner has been declared as a proclaimed person in case FIR No. 24 dated 17.03.2013 under Sections 498-A and 406 IPC registered at Police Station Subhanpur, District Kapurthala.

2. On the last date of hearing, following order was passed:-

“Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing the impugned order dated 28.10.2013 (Annexure P-3) passed by the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Kapurthala, whereby proclamation under Section 82 Cr.P.C. was issued and the petitioner has been declared as a Proclaimed Person in case FIR No. 24, dated 17.03.2013, under



Sections 498-A and 406 IPC, registered at Police Station Subhanpur, District Kapurthala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the co-accused of the petitioner, who are his parents, have already been acquitted by the learned trial Court, vide judgment dated 31.10.2017 (Annexure P-5).

Notice of motion.

Having received advance copy of the petition, Ms. Himani Arora, A.A.G., Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1-State and seeks time to file reply.

Adjourned to 05.12.2024 for service of respondent No. 2.

In the meantime, the petitioner shall appear before the learned trial Court within a period of two months from today and deposit a sum of Rs. 2,00,000/- as costs of litigation with the State of Punjab. Upon the petitioner doing so, he shall be released on interim bail upon his furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court, till the next date of hearing before this Court.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner has produced a photostat copy of receipt of Rs.2 lakhs being cost of litigation paid before the Court of Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Kapurthala on 24.10.2024, which is taken on record and submits that the petitioner has surrendered before the learned trial Court and he has also been granted bail by the said Court, therefore, the instant petition has been rendered infructuous.

4. Disposed of, as having become infructuous.
