1. Petitioner Solter Aloysius has filed petition under Section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (earlier Section 438 of Cr.P.C.) for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 199 dated 17.06.2024 under Section 376, 354, 354-A of IPC and Section 4 and 9 of POCSO Act (Amended) 2012/ 2019 registered at Police Station Derabassi, Police Post Mubarikpur, District SAS Nagar (Mohali), Punjab.

2. As per the facts of case, zero FIR No. 03 dated 12.06.2024 was registered under Section 376, 354, 354-A of IPC and Section 4 and 8 of POCSO Act at Women Police Station, District Shimla, Himachal Pradesh and on that basis, present FIR was registered at Police Station Derabassi, SAS Nagar, Punjab. Complainant 'SK' came alongwith his minor daughter and submitted written complaint alleging that he belongs to State of Kerala and was working as Driver with Sadhvi Kalyan Giri Shree Punch Dashbhag Avhan Akhara Shree Kashi Ji who is residing in a rented flat No. B-105, Silver City, Derabassi, Punjab. Victim is his daughter, aged about



14 years who used to live with Sadhvi Ji. One person namely Solter Aloysius met him in Delhi in October 2023 who wanted to meet Sadhvi Ji. He also suggested that he is SPG Commando and can arrange donations for Sadhvi Ji. During this time, he (complainant) bought a car bearing registration No. DL 3C BR 9379. Said Solter Aloysius used to ask him for his car. When he declined to give the car, he came alongwith Sahil to the said flat on 18.04.2024 at about 09:00 am and rang the doorbell. Sadhvi Ji opened the door and aforesaid persons started beating him. They asked for keys of the car, to which he declined. He gave keys of the car to his daughter and told her to go down and call police. On the way, his daughter was stopped by Solter Aloysius and he did wrongful act with her, but his daughter did not give the keys of car. Said persons left the spot. Later on, he came to know that said persons had already stolen his car on the previous night and on that day, they had come only to get the keys of car. With these allegations, present FIR has been registered.

3. Learned counsel for petitioner argued that all allegations levelled against him are false. Infact, complainant and petitioner were close to each other since 2022. Complainant portrayed himself to be an Income Tax Officer and he had assured to secure a job for him in Government sector. In lieu of this, he had made payment of approximately Rs. 20 lacs to the persons namely Kulwinder Singh Bragta, Sadhvi Ji and complainant. Copies of bank accounts are also annexed. Petitioner came to Delhi and bought second hand car make Hyundai Verna bearing registration No. DL 3C BR 9379 on 04.12.2023 after making payment of Rs. 2,21,000/- through online transaction. Registration of aforesaid car was prepared in favour of complainant. Complainant gave NOC regarding said vehicle in



favour of petitioner as a debt towards him. Insurance of car was taken in the name of petitioner. Complainant played fraud with him. He requested complainant to return his car, but he refused. Finally matter was resolved and car was returned to him which he drove to his native place in Kerala. Petitioner is falsely implicated in this FIR. In pursuance of order passed by this Court dated 26.03.2025, he was granted interim relief and subsequently, he was also directed to join investigation. Now he has fully cooperated with Investigating Agency. Therefore, his anticipatory bail petition may be allowed.

4. Detailed status report has been filed. As per status report, prosecutrix was taken to Civil Hospital, Derabassi, where she refused to undergo medical examination. Her statement was recorded before Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Derabassi under Section 183 of BNSS, 2023. In compliance of orders passed by this Court, petitioner has joined investigation and it is confirmed that he is not required for any other purpose.

5. Considering the aforesaid factual position, no purpose would be served by sending petitioner behind the bars. He has already cooperated with Investigating Agency. Matter is under investigation. In the light of this, anticipatory bail petition filed by petitioner is allowed. He be not arrested. In case of his arrest, he be released on bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer concerned, subject to condition that petitioner will join investigation as and when required. He will not tamper with or interfere with investigation and will not leave country without prior permission as provided under Section 482(2) of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
