The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 483 of B.N.S.S with a prayer to grant regular bail to her in a case FIR No. 07, dated 21.02.2025, under Sections 61(2) and 318(2) of B.N.S and later on 318(4) of B.N.S and 13 of Punjab Travel Regulation Act added, registered at Police Station Sadar Gurdaspur, District Gurdaspur (Annexure P-1).

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the FIR was initially registered against five persons namely Gurdial Singh, Chahalpreet Singh, Jasbir Kaur (petitioner), Amarjit Singh and Paramjeet Kaur. He further contends that as per the allegations levelled by the complainant, the accused had cheated the complainant side to the tune of Rs.32,25,000/-. Learned counsel further contends that the petitioner has been involved in the present case as she happens to be wife of Gurdial Singh, main accused, whereas, Gurdial Singh has already been arrested by the police in the present case. Learned counsel further

contends that the petitioner is a household lady and was wrongly arrested by the police on 31.05.2025. Now, the investigation is almost complete against her and her custody may not serve any meaningful purpose.

3. On the other hand, learned State counsel has vehemently opposed the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner on the ground that the petitioner is involved in the crime along with other family members and she does not deserve the concession of bail by this Court.

4. I have heard the learned counsel for the parties and perused the record carefully in the present case.

5. In the present case, apparently, the allegations have been primarily levelled against Gurdial Singh and others. The prosecution is yet to lead evidence with regard to the involvement of the petitioner in the present case. Even otherwise, the petitioner is in custody for the last about 01 month and the prosecution has yet to lead evidence with regard to her involvement in the present case. Even otherwise, Gurdial Singh, main accused is in jail and further custody of the petitioner will not serve any meaningful purpose.

6. Without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate/Chief Judicial Magistrate.
