KARAMJIT SINGH, J. (Oral)

Prayer is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in criminal case having FIR No.86 dated 14.06.2024 registered under Sections 307, 341, 427, 148, 149 of IPC and Sections 25, 27, 54, 59 of Arms Act, 1959 at Police Station Talwandi Sabo, District Bathinda.

2. On the last date of hearing it was brought to the notice of the Court that no specific injury is attributed to the present petitioner, who was armed with baseball bat. Resultantly, the petitioner was granted concession of interim bail with direction to join investigation with the police.

3. Today, counsel for the petitioner submits that by virtue of the aforesaid order, the petitioner has joined investigation with the police.



4. Counsel appearing on behalf of the complainant while resisting the present petition submits that petitioner was member of unlawful assembly and one of its member namely Sukhwinder Singh caused firearm injury to Sukhpreet Singh.

5. Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Rajinder Kumar submits that the petitioner, who has joined investigation with the police is not required by the police for further investigation or custodial interrogation and the recovery of baseball bat used in commission of crime is effected at the instance of the present petitioner.

6. The liability of the present petitioner under Section 307 of IPC is fastened only with the aid of Section 149 of IPC. Otherwise only simple injuries that too with blunt weapon are attributed to the present petitioner and further the recovery of weapon used by the petitioner at the time of occurrence is already effected and petitioner is not required by the police for the purpose of further investigation.

7. In light of the above, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and order of interim bail dated 27.11.2024 is hereby made absolute subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023.
