1. Through the instant writ petition filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, a prayer is made for issuance of a *mandamus* upon respondents no.1 and 2 to grant permit of a school bus bearing Registration No.HR-69A-3687, by extending the life of the said vehicle.

2. The grievance which propelled the present petitioner to file the instant petition is the lackadaisical and indolent approach of the authority concerned, by not deciding representation/application (Annexure P-7) of the present petitioner, which is pending since 23.12.2024.

3. This Court vide order dated 01.04.2025, had passed the hereinafter extracted order:-

“The grievance of the petitioner is that representation Annexure P/7, which is pending since 23.12.2024, has not been decided by the Transport Commissioner, Haryana.

Without issuing notice of motion, Mr. Bhupender Singh, DAG, Haryana, who is representing the respondents, is directed to have apt instructions, as to how much time is required to decide the representation Annexure P/7.

Adjourned to 24.4.2025. ”

4. In deference to the directions (*supra*), today, learned State counsel, informs this Court that the authority concerned, has passed a speaking order on dated 16.04.2025, and has placed on record a copy thereof. The same is ordered to be taken on record as Annexure 'A'.

5. The order (*supra*), reflects that the claim of the present petitioner has been rejected.

6. Since the grievance, as incapsulated in the instant petition, has already been redressed, therefore, no further direction is required to be passed in the instant matter. However, in case, the petitioner fetches any grievance from the order (*supra*), as passed by the authority concerned, the petitioner is at liberty to challenge the same by taking legal recourse, as available with them.

5. **Disposed of** accordingly.
