Main case

1. By way of this petition filed under Section 528 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023, the petitioners seek quashing of GD No.43 dated 08.01.2025 under Sections 115(2), 191(3), 190 of Bharatiya Nayaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023 registered at Police Station Rangar Nangal, District Batala in FIR No.2 dated 07.01.2025 under Sections 115(2), 118(1), 191(3), 190 of BNS, registered at Police Station Rangar Nangal, District Batala alongwith all consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise (Annexures P-1).

2. Notice of motion.

3. Mr. Kamalpreet Bawa, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the



respondent-State.

4. Mr. Harmanpreet Singh, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of respondent Nos.2 to 4 and has filed Power of Attorney and confirms the factum of the compromise having been effected between the parties and states that respondent Nos.2 to 4 have no objection to the quashing of FIR in question.

5. Learned State counsel has stated no objection in case the FIR is quashed based upon the compromise. He further states that there are no criminal antecedents *qua* the petitioners.

6. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the material placed on record.

8. In view of the above, even if this case is taken to its logical conclusion, it would only be an exercise in futility as the parties have already settled their differences, therefore, no purpose would be served in wasting the time and resources of the State in pursuing this case to its pre-ordained end. It would, therefore, be better to give a quietus to the issue at this stage.

9. Accordingly, the petition is **allowed** and GD No.43 dated 08.01.2025 under Sections 115(2), 191(3), 190 of Bharatiya Nayaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023 registered at Police Station Rangar Nangal, District Batala in FIR No.2 dated 07.01.2025 under Sections 115(2), 118(1), 191(3), 190 of BNS, registered at Police Station Rangar Nangal, District Batala alongwith all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are quashed *qua* the petitioners.

10. Needless to say that the parties shall remain bound by the terms of compromise.
