1. This application has been filed for placing on record certified copies of *zimni* orders from 04.10.2024 to 04.07.2025 as Annexure P-19 and photocopy of *zimni* orders dated 25.07.2025 and order dated 26.08.2025 as Annexures P-20 and P-21.

2. For the reasons mentioned in the application, same is allowed. Annexures P-19 to P-21 are taken on record subject to all just exceptions.

1. Instant petition has been filed under Section 528 of BNSS for issuance of directions to official respondents to present final report/cancellation report in case FIR No.139 dated 14.06.2019 registered under Sections 354-A, 354-B, 354-D, 506, 427 IPC at Police Station Division No.6, District Police Commissionerate Ludhiana, as

the police has failed to present the final report/cancellation report in the competent Court of jurisdiction.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that earlier the police had filed cancellation report on 12.06.2020, however, the same was not accepted by the Court and reinvestigation was ordered. Now the police has again filed cancellation report on 25.07.2025 before the trial Court.

3. The grievance raised by learned counsel for the petitioner is that despite presentation of cancellation report before the Court, the same is not being accepted by the Court only due to the absence of the complainant who is residing abroad and this fact has already been noticed by the Court in its order dated 25.07.2025. He has placed reliance upon the judgment of this Court in ***CRM-M-44143 of 2020 (Jasveer Singh v. State of Punjab and another) decided on 11.08.2021*** to contend that even if the complainant is not appearing before the trial Court, there is no bar for the acceptance of the cancellation report.

4. In this view of the matter, learned counsel for the petitioner wishes to withdraw the present petition with liberty to avail his remedy before the trial Court.

5. Dismissed as withdrawn with aforesaid liberty.

6. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
