KULDEEP TIWARI, J. (Oral)

1. Through the instant writ petition, as cast under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, a prayer is made for issuance of a Mandamus upon respondent No.1-College to allow the petitioner to take his examinations of 10th Semester of BA. LLB Program.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that, owing to non-deposit of fee for 9th and 10th semesters, the petitioner was not allowed to appear in 10th semester examinations.

3. This Court has heard learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the records.

4. In fact, the petitioner had served a legal notice dated 05.06.2025 (Annexure P-2), to which, the respondent-College responded, vide reply dated 11.06.2025 (Annexure P-3). It was specifically mentioned by the College that petitioner was issued roll number/admit card, and he even appeared in two examinations of 10th semester.



However, he deliberately skipped the examination, which was scheduled for 28.05.2025, at his own will and contention.

5. Upon being pointedly asked, as to whether any examination of 10th semester is yet to be scheduled, learned counsel for the petitioner fairly submits that examinations are already over, and petitioner has to re-appear in the examinations.

6. In view of the above, and as informed by learned counsel for the petitioner that examinations with respect to 10th semester are already over, no direction is required to be passed upon respondent No.1. However, the petitioner is at liberty to approach the respondent-College, for re-appearing in the examinations.

7. Accordingly, the instant writ petition is **disposed of**.
