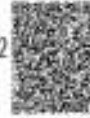

SURYA PARTAP SINGH, J. (Oral):

For the commission of offence punishable under Sections 302, 34 of IPC and 25 of Arms Act 1959 (Sections 120-B, 201 of IPC and 29 of Arms Act were added later on), the FIR No.196 dated 21.07.2022, has been lodged in Police Station Chhansa, District Faridabad. The petitioner has been arrested in the above mentioned case as an accused. Since the petitioner is in custody, he has filed the present petition for the benefit of bail.

2. This is third petition under Section 483 of BNSS for grant of bail filed by the petitioner. The second bail petition was dismissed as withdrawn on 12.03.2025 when any witness was not examined.

3. The above mentioned order reads as under:- “After arguing for some time, when this Court was not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner, a prayer was made by learned counsel for the petitioner for withdrawal of the



instant petition at this stage. Dismissed as withdrawn.”

4. A bare perusal of above mentioned order shows that the second petition for bail was withdrawn, when the Court was not inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

5. It has been contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that after dismissal of second bail petition, the statement of complainant has been recorded.

6. Per contra, the learned State counsel being assisted by learned counsel for the complainant has submitted that other material private witnesses are yet to be examined in this case.

7. In view of above, in my opinion, there is no change of circumstances, which, may make the petitioner eligible to file third petition for bail. Hence, finding no ground, the present bail petition is hereby dismissed.
