By way of this writ petition filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner prays for issuance of a writ of mandamus for directing the respondents to count the daily wages service period from September, 1988 to 28.07.2000 along with regular service for the purpose of granting the pensionary benefits.

2. Learned counsel contends that petitioner also sent a representation dated 19.07.2024 (Annexure P-3), but no action has been taken on the same till date.

3. It is noticed by this Court that as per the contention of the petitioner, he was initially appointed on daily wages in September, 1988 and was terminated in September 1989. Later on, he joined the respondent-department after a gap of 09 years in May, 1998 and then was made as work charged on 12.10.1999. He retired on 31.01.2019 and approached this Court in January, 2025.

4. At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he will be satisfied if his representation dated 19.07.2024 (Annexure P-3) is considered and decided by passing a speaking order in the time bound manner.

5. Notice of motion.



6. Mr. Rajesh Sehgal, Addl. AG., Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and submits that he has no objection to the prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

7. Heard.

8. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case or the claim being made by the petitioner in the present petition, respondents are directed to consider the grievances put forth by the petitioner in representation dated 19.07.2024 (Annexure P-3), in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. While deciding the representation, respondents will keep in mind the observations made in Para No.3 of this order.

9. The petition stands disposed of.
