1. The instant petition has been filed by the petitioner for directions to the respondents No.2 to 4 to proceed with the complaint dated 29.11.2024, and take action against the respondents No.5 to 7.
2. The learned counsel representing the petitioner submits that the petitioner has filed a representation dated 29.11.2025 (Annexure P-3) before the respondent No.3. The learned counsel prays for directions to the respondent No.3 to decide the abovementioned representation within a stipulated time.
3. Notice of motion to respondents No.1 to 4.



4. Mr. Eklavya Darshi, Deputy Advocate General, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondents No.1 to 4, and waives service.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that a direction for disposing of the representation of the petitioner (Annexure P-3) be given to the respondent No.3 and that the instant writ petition be disposed of accordingly.

7. Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, the present writ petition is hereby disposed of with a direction to the respondent No.3 to decide the representation of the petitioner (Annexure P-3) by passing a speaking order within a period of 15 days from the date of receipt of copy of instant order. It is however clarified that no finding is being returned, by this Court, with regard to merits of the contents of representation. The respondent No.3 shall be at liberty to make an assessment with regard to contents of representation of the petitioner and make an independent decision at his own level.
