1. Learned counsel for the appellant assails judgment dated 21.04.2017 passed by learned Additional District Judge, Kurukshetra, vide which her petition under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act has been dismissed.



2. Learned counsel representing the respondent has stated at the very outset that the respondent does not have any objection for getting the marriage dissolved by way of mutual consent.
3. Even the learned counsel representing the petitioner has accepted the aforesaid proposal. The petitioner, who is present in person, has also stated that she is open to filing a petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act.
4. Learned counsel for the appellant thus submitted that the appellant may be permitted to withdraw the instant appeal with liberty to approach the Family Court so as to file a petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act.
5. In view of the aforesaid submission, the instant appeal is dismissed as withdrawn with liberty aforesaid.
