DEEPAK GUPTA, J. (Oral)

By way of present petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, petitioner prays for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus by directing the respondents to pay the arrears of pay and pension after revision of pay as per the Punjab Civil Services (Revised Pay) Rules 2021, which came into force w.e.f. 01.01.2016 as amended till date. Petitioner further prays that after revision of pay, the gratuity and leave encashment also needs to be revised and for grant of difference of gratuity and leave encashment after revision of pay and he be also granted one increment in view of judgment in CWP No.8364 of 2024 titled as *Suresh Kumar Vs. State of Haryana*. Further prayer has been made to direct the respondents to grant all the arrears of pay and pension with interest @ 18% per annum.

2. Learned counsel submits that petitioner also sent a legal notice dated 18.09.2024 (Annexure P.3) upon the respondents but no action has been taken so far upon the legal notice.

2. Learned counsel also submits that the petitioner will be satisfied in case the respondents are directed to take a decision on the legal notice dated 18.09.2024 (Annexure P.3) by passing a speaking order.

3. Notice of motion.

4. Mr. Rajesh Sehgal, Addl. AG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents. He has no objection to the prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have gone through the record of the case.



6. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case or the claim being made by the petitioner in the present petition, respondents are directed to consider the grievances put forth by the petitioner in legal notice dated 18.09.2024 (Annexure P.3), in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

7. The petition stands disposed of.
