Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondent(s) for not complying the order dated 16.1.2025 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-965-2025 titled as “Amrit Parkash Singh Dhillon vs. State of Punjab and others”, vide which the petition was disposed of on the basis of statement made by learned counsel for the respondent-State that “...in case, the legal notice dated 25.10.2024 (Annexure P-5) has been received in the office of the concerned authorities and the same is still pending consideration with the authorities concerned, the same will be decided by the competent authority within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of



certified copy of this order by passing an appropriate speaking order. Learned counsel further submits that in case, it is found feasible to accept the claim of the petitioner, the same will be accepted, otherwise due reasons will be mentioned for not accepting the claim of the petitioner in the speaking order to be passed and the said order will be duly conveyed to the petitioner.”

Learned counsel for the respondent-State, on instructions, submits that necessary compliance has been made, while passing a speaking order dated 03.3.2025 by the respondent-Secretary, State of Punjab; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

Copy of the aforesaid order dated 03.3.2025 produced by the learned counsel for the respondent-State is taken on record. Copy thereof is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner(s). Registry to tag/paginate the same at appropriate place in the paper-book.

In view of the above, the present petition stands **dismissed**.

However, liberty is granted to the petitioner to challenge the aforesaid speaking order dated 03.3.2025 as per law.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
