Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondent for not complying the order dated 09.2.2023 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-2655-2023 titled as “Sudesh and others vs. State of Haryana and others”, vide which the respondent was directed *..to decide the legal notice dated 14.11.2022 (Annexure P-3) by passing a speaking order within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order.*”

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the order dated 09.2.2023 (Annexure P-1) has been complied with and a Speaking Order dated 07.12.2023 has been



passed by the respondent-authority and therefore the present petition may be disposed of as such.

Learned counsel for the respondent-State also submits that necessary compliance has been made, while passing a Speaking Order dated 07.12.2023 by the respondent-authority; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

Copy of the aforesaid order dated 07.12.2023 produced by the learned counsel for the respondent-State is taken on record. Copy thereof is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner. Registry to tag/paginate the same at appropriate place in the paper-book.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed in the present petition, the same is **disposed of** accordingly.
