JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to respondent to revise his pension w.e.f. 31.01.2010.

2. The respondent pursuant to orders dated 19.03.2016 of Civil Court, order dated 10.10.2016 of Appellate Court, order dated 01.02.2023 passed by this Court in RSA No.5049 of 2017 and order dated 20.02.2023 passed by this Court in RSA No.4870 of 2017 re-fixed salary of the petitioner. On account of re-fixation of salary, arrears accrued to the tune of Rs.4,19,636/-. The respondent by order dated 17.03.2023 re-determined salary as well as consequential arrears, however, did not revise pension. The respondents are claiming that service book is not available. Commissioner &



Secretary, Urban Local Bodies Department vide communication dated 09.10.2024 asked Executive Officer, Municipal Council Bahadurgarh to provide service book, first and second ACP related orders to Director, Urban Local Bodies so that matter may be settled. The Executive Officer, Municipal Council Bahadurgarh vide communication dated 04.11.2024 informed Commissioner & Secretary Urban Local Bodies, Department that service book of the petitioner has been lost from the office of Director, therefore, on the basis of photocopy revision of pension may be approved.

3. Ms. Rajni Gupta, Advocate submits that respondents No. 3 and 4 have no objection if pension is revised on the basis of available photocopy of service book.

4. Mr. Raman Sharma, Addl. A.G., Haryana, on instructions from Ms. Monika, Joint Director, Urban Local Bodies Department, Haryana who is present in Court, submits that needful would be done within two months from today. The pension of the petitioner would be re-fixed in accordance with law and orders passed by this Court.

5. Counsel for the petitioner agrees to the aforesaid arrangement.

6. In the wake of statement of both sides, the instant petition stands disposed of.
