Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondent(s) for not complying the order dated 01.2.2024 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-2054-2024 titled as “Kamla Devi vs. State of Haryana and others”, vide which the petition was disposed of on the basis of statement made by learned counsel for the State that “*....in case any representation is received from the petitioner by respondents No.2 or 3, the same will be considered in accordance with law and an appropriate speaking order will be passed within a period of 08 weeks from the date of receipt of any such representation and in case after the decision, the petitioner is found entitled for any*



relief, the same will be extended to her otherwise, due reasons will be given in the said speaking order.”

Pursuant to order dated 24.4.2025, Compliance Report dated 26.6.2025 by way of affidavit of Shri Hanish Kumar, Block Development and Panchayat Officer, Ratia has already been filed by the State in the Registry, which has been annexed with the file.

Learned counsel for the respondent-State submits that necessary compliance has been made, while passing a speaking order dated 02.8.2024 (Annexure R-1) annexed with the Compliance Report; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

Copy of the aforesaid Compliance Report alongwith the Speaking Order dated 02.8.2024 (Annexure R-1) is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner(s). Registry to tag/paginate the same at appropriate place in the paper-book.

Learned counsel for the petitioner does not dispute the same and submits that in view of the above, the present petition has been rendered infructuous and the same may be disposed of as such.

Ordered accordingly.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
