FATEH SINGH VS. RAMOTAR AND OTHERS

Learned counsel for the appellant has referred to the discharge summary of the appellant showing his injury, for the purpose of settlement, which is reproduced herein:-

Patient was admitted with alleged h/o RTA followed by pain in back and right side chest in evening on 26.01.2015. He was hit by bus while he was riding bike. There was no h/o LOC, ENT bleeding, seizure, vomiting and long bone injury. Initially he took primary treatment at Narnol Hospital and then referred to higher centre.

At the time of admission patient's GCS was E4M6V5, tenderness over right side chest and back, moving all 4 limbs, pulse 108/min, BP 115/75 mm. Hg, Spo98% afebrile.

Patient was put in expectant line management and investigated radiologically. CT HEAD (26.01.2015) showed small subcortical hmeorrhange in left parietal lobe. Rest normal study.

MRI whole spine screening (26.01.2015) showed mild circumferential disc bulges at L4-5 level causing mild b/1 lateral recess stenosis. Otherwise no significant interval changes.

He was further investigated for his head injury and underwent MR Brain Screening (27.01.2015) which showed evidence of multiple microhemorrhages at grey white junction in b/1 parietal lobes and left frontal lobe-s/0 DAI Grade-1. Minimal SDH in right hemisphere.

The family was counselled for further hospital stay for Neuro-observation and likely complications of Head Injury were explained to the family members. They refused for further hospital stay and requested for discharge so patient is being discharged on request.

At the time discharge patient's GCS is 15/15, moving all 4 limbs, no neurological deficit, orally tolerating, self voiding afebrile.”

As agreed, as per statement of the representatives of the Insurance Company and counsel for the appellant, (separately recorded today), a sum of Rs.1,60,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Sixty Thousand only) more, over and above, the amount awarded by the Tribunal is allowed to the appellant, in full and final settlement of the claim in this appeal. As per the statement of learned counsel for the appellant the enhanced amount would be paid to the appellant-Fateh Singh.

We dispose of this case with a direction to Insurance Company to deposit a crossed-cheque in the sum of Rs.1,60,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Sixty Thousand only) in the name of the appellant-Fateh Singh with the office of the Lok Adalat of the High Court on or before 14.10.2025 failing which the amount will carry 9% interest p.a. from the date of this order till the cheque is deposited with the office of the Lok Adalat. The appellant's counsel/appellant may collect the cheque from the office of the Lok Adalat.

Copy of the order/statement be supplied /sent to the counsel/parties and file be returned to the High Court.
