Prayer in this petition is for initiation of contempt proceedings against the respondent for not complying the order dated 28.4.2025 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-11493-2025 titled as “Mansirat Kaur (being minor through her natural guardian mother) and another vs. Union of India and another” the petition was dismissed as having been rendered infructuous on the basis of statement made by learned counsel for the respondent-UOI to the effect that “*....petitioners have not supplied ‘Annexure C’. She further submits that in case the petitioners supply ‘Annexure C’, their case will be dealt with, in accordance with law.*”

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that since the passports have been issued to the petitioners,



the present contempt petition has been rendered infructuous and the same may be disposed of as such.

In view of the above noted facts and submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioners, the present contempt petition is **disposed of** accordingly.
