Instant petition has been preferred under Section 528 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023 (BNSS) seeking quashing of the FIR (Annexure P-1), and all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise effected between the parties on 21.03.2025 (Annexure P-5) Details of the FIR are as under: -

2. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, the parties have arrived at a settlement vide compromise

deed dated 21.03.2025 (Annexure P-5), which is duly signed by them. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties.

3. Learned Civil Judge (Jr. Divn)-cum-JMIC, Bahadurgarh, vide report dated 11.04.2025, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

4. Respondents Nos. 2 to 5 are represented by their counsel and do not oppose the compromise.

5. In view of the aforesaid report of learned Civil Judge (Jr. Divn)-cum-JMIC, Bahadurgarh, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in "*Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another*", 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and "*Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another*", (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since respondents No. 2 to 5 have themselves compromised the dispute with the petitioners.

6. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. FIR No.24 dated 26.01.2024 (Annexure P-1) under Sections 148, 149, 307, 323, 324, 326, 452, 506 IPC and Section 27 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station Sector 06 Bahadurgarh, and all consequential
