The order dated 10.07.2014, the non compliance of which the petitioner alleges, required the respondents of the writ petition to remit the arrears of the eligible persons within a period of two months, the compliance of which has since been made as has been stated at bar by the learned senior counsel appearing for the respondents, rendering the instant petition infructuous, which is disposed of accordingly, leaving the petitioner to his remedies in law in the event of his dissatisfaction against the order so passed.

In view of the reply submitted explaining the delay in passing a speaking order which has been attributed to the remedies in law availed of by the respondents, the costs component is waived off.
