MAHESH GROVER, J.

The order dated 20.12.2013 non-compliance of which has been alleged by the petitioner was subjected to LPA where after admission it has been modified.

Learned counsel for the petitioner repeatedly insisted on adjournment whereas the order by which the interim order was modified was passed in his presence. To be fair to the Court he ought to have stated this fact in the beginning rather than continuously insisting on adjournment.

Hence, instant contempt petition stands dismissed in view of the fact that the orders, non-compliance of which the petitioner alleges stands modified, liberating the respondents from compliance thereof.
