1. Present petition has been filed by the petitioner, seeking grant of regular bail, in case, FIR No.85, dated 16.09.2023, under Section 22 of the NDPS Act, registered at Police Station Hathur, District Ludhiana.
2. As per the allegations, petitioner was standing in front of her own house, opposite the Government Primary School. Upon seeing the police team, she panicked and attempted to go inside her house, while doing so, she dropped something which she was holding in her left hand. On search of the transparent plastic bag, 400 tablets of Buprenorphine Hydrochloride capsules, weighing a total of 49.200 grams was recovered.
3. Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner, who is a woman, has already undergone sufficient incarceration and is entitled to the provisions of Section 480 of BNSS.

4. It is noticed that petitioner's first regular bail petition was dismissed as withdrawn, vide order dated 02.05.2024 in CRM-M-6245-2024 (Annexure P-2).

5. On the other hand, learned State counsel has filed custody certificate dated 14.10.2025 in the Court today and the same is taken on record.

As per the custody certificate, in the present case, petitioner has already undergone 02 years and 26 days period inside jail.

6. Status report dated 20.05.2025 appended with the present petition reveals that petitioner has already been convicted in six other NDPS cases.

7. On being asked by the Court, learned State counsel informs that out of total 11 prosecution witnesses, only 03 are left to be examined.

8. Considering the overall circumstances and petitioner's prior convictions, this Court finds no grounds to grant regular bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, present petition is **dismissed**.

However, learned trial Court is directed to expedite the trial and decide the matter expeditiously, in accordance with the law.
