1. Present order would dispose of two revision petitions. The first petition being CR-3230-2025 titled as “Apurity Hospitality Vs. Gurpreet Singh and others”, in which challenge is to the order dated 14.05.2025 (Annexure P-15) passed by the Additional District Judge, Chandigarh in Civil Appeal No.61 of 2025, whereby the application

under Order 41 Rule 5 CPC for staying the operation of the judgment and decree dated 10.02.2025 passed by the Civil Judge (Senior Division), Chandigarh has been disposed of. In the second petition bearing no.CR-3231-2025 titled as “M/s Apurity Hospitality and others Vs. Gurpreet Singh and others”, challenge is to the order dated 14.05.2025 (Annexure P-14) passed by the Additional District Judge, Chandigarh in Civil Appeal No.65 of 2025, whereby the application under Order 41 Rule 5 CPC for staying the operation of the judgment and decree dated 10.02.2025 passed by the Civil Judge (Senior Division), Chandigarh has been disposed of.
