YASHVIR SINGH RATHOR. J.(Oral)

1. Prayer in this petition under Section 482 of BNSS, 2023 is for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.69, dated 14.06.2025, registered at Police Station Rangar Nangal, District Batala (Gurdaspur), under Sections 115(2), 118(1), 117(2), 118(2) and 3(5) of BNS, 2023.

2. Status report dated 04.10.2025 by way of affidavit of Harish Behal, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, NDPS Batala has been filed on behalf of respondent-State and the same is taken on record.

3. On 19.08.2025, following order was passed:-

“Prayer in this petition under Section 482 of BNSS, 2023 is for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.69, dated 14.06.2025, registered at Police Station Rangar Nangal, District Batala (Gurdaspur), under Sections 115(2), 118(1), 117(2), 118(2) and 3(5) of BNS, 2023.

The present case was registered on the basis statement given to the police by Gurdeep Singh with the allegation that on 02.06.2025, at 6:30 P.M. he had started cultivating 1 kanal of land owned by Major Singh and in the meanwhile, Nirvail Singh, who is brother of Major Singh armed with a Dang/Lathi, Gurman Singh armed with a

Datar, Kirandeep Singh armed with a Baseball bat and Harjit Kaur who was empty handed came there. Harjit Kaur challenged him and all others to catch hold of him and to teach him a lesson for taking the land of her brother in law on lease. Thereafter, Nirvail Singh gave three Daang/lathi blows on the back side of his head, on right shoulder and on back as well. Gurman Singh gave two Datar blows which hit on his left shoulder and left arm. Thereafter, he fell down and Kirandeep Singh hit him twice with his Baseball bat on his left hand finger and right foot finger. When he cried for help, his wife was attracted to the spot and accused persons were ran away alongwith their weapons.

Learned counsel for the petitioner argued that they have been falsely implicated and true version has been suppressed. Cross case has been registered vide DDR No.32 dated 01.07.2023 against the opposite party as well for causing injuries to Kirandeep Singh who is the son of petitioner Nirvail Singh. Learned counsel next contended that two of the co-accused namely Kirandeep Singh and Harjit Kaur have been granted benefit of anticipatory bail by the Court of Sessions. Only simple injuries are attributed to the petitioner. He is ready to join the investigation and to abide by the conditions that may be imposed by the Court and benefit of anticipatory bail be extended in his favour.

On the other hand, learned State counsel has opposed prayer and argued that petitioner has committed a heinous offence. The lathi used in committing the crime is yet to be recovered and he does not deserve the benefit of anticipatory bail.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Gorav Kathuria, DAG Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State. A copy of paper book be supplied to him during the course of day.

*Adjourned to **14.10.2025** for filing status report. Meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation and in the event of*

his arrest, he shall be admitted to ad-interim bail on furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall abide by the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) BNSS/438(2) Cr.P.C.

4. Today, learned State counsel has informed this Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation, in compliance of the order dated 19.08.2025 and is no longer required for further investigation.
5. In view of the aforesaid, the order dated 19.08.2025, whereby the petitioner was granted interim anticipatory bail, is hereby made absolute. However, he shall continue to join investigation, if and so required by the Investigating Officer.
6. Pending misc application (s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
