The petition has been filed *inter alia* seeking a writ of *mandamus* directing respondents no.1 to 8 to protect life, liberty and property of the petitioner and her family members who are under grave threat at the hands of respondents no.10 to 13.

2. Learned counsel contends that despite repeated representations, no steps have been taken to protect the petitioner's life and liberty by the respondents. He has referred to a representation dated 23.03.2023, Annexure P-5, in that regard. It is also contended that the representation has been sent to the official respondents herein, in particular respondent no.4, through the Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi.

3. Learned State counsel, on instructions, contends that the representation has not been received/marked to the fourth respondent, as contended by learned counsel for the petitioner. However, as the matter has now

come to their notice by way of the instant petition, appropriate action on the representation, dated 23.03.2023, will be taken by the fourth respondent-Senior Superintendent of Police, District SAS Nagar, Mohali, in accordance with law within a period of three weeks.

4. In view of the statement made, learned counsel for the petitioner has no objection to the petition being disposed of in terms thereof.

5. Ordered accordingly.

6. Pending application(s), if any, also stand(s) disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
