Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondent for not complying the order dated 06.10.2023 (Annexure P-5) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-21614-2023 titled as “Dr. Kuljit Kumar vs. State of Haryana and others”, vide which the petition with disposed of with a direction “...to respondent No.1/Additional Chief Secretary, Department of Medical Education and Research, Government of Haryana, to consider and decide the pending representation, dated 04.10.2023, and re-issue the NOC in the prescribed format unless legally untenable, within a period of one week from the date of receiving a certified copy of this order.”



Compliance report dated 13.12.2023 by way of affidavit of Dr. Sumita Misra, IAS, Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana, Medical Education and Research Department, Chandigarh has already been filed in the Registry, which is annexed on the file. The same is taken on record. Copy thereof is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner.

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the directions issued by this Court vide order dated 06.10.2023 (Annexure P-5) have been complied with and a Speaking Order dated 03.10.2023 (Annexure R-1 annexed with the Compliance Report dated 13.12.2023) has been passed by the respondent-authority, and therefore submits that the present petition has been rendered infructuous and the same may be disposed of as such.

Learned counsel for the respondent-State also submits that necessary compliance has been made, while passing a speaking order dated 03.10.2023 (Annexure R-1) by the respondent-authority; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

In view of the above noted facts and the submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner, the present contempt petition is hereby **disposed of** as having been rendered infructuous.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
