Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondent for not complying the order dated 24.7.2024 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-17127-2024 titled as “Sandeep Singh vs. State of Punjab and others”, vide which the petition was disposed of on the basis of statement made by learned counsel for the respondents to the effect that “*....in case the petitioner has any grievance, he can file appropriate representation with the authorities concerned and in case any such claim is raised by the petitioner by way of representation, the same will be decided by the competent authority within a period of eight weeks of the receipt of any such claim and in case, after the decision any relief is to be extended to the petitioner, the same will be extended to him, otherwise due reasons will be mentioned in the speaking order to be passed for not accepting the claim of the petitioner for his information and necessary action.*”



Compliance report dated 21.1.2025 by way of affidavit of Dr. Sneha Aggarwal, IAS, Director Social Security Women and Child Development, Punjab has already been filed in the Registry, which is annexed on the file. The same is taken on record. Copy thereof is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the respondent-State submits that necessary compliance has been made, while passing a Speaking Order dated 17.1.2025 (Annexure R-2 annexed with the Compliance Report) by the respondent-authority; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that since the order dated 24.7.2024 (Annexure P-1) has been complied with and a Speaking Order dated 17.1.2025 (Annexure R-2) has been passed by the respondent-authority, the present contempt petition may be disposed of, however, liberty may be granted to the petitioner to challenge the said Speaking Order dated 17.1.2025 (Annexure R-2) as per law, if so advised.

Heard.

In view of the facts noted above and the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner, the present contempt petition is **disposed of** with the liberty aforesaid.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
