Application under Section 528 of BNSS has been filed for placing on record reply on behalf of the complainant along with Annexure R-1 and R-2, which is taken on record subject to all just exceptions. Registry is directed to tag the same at an appropriate place.

Main case

1. Prayer in the present petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in case FIR No.211 dated 23.08.2024, registered under Sections 120-B, 420, 467, 468 & 471 IPC, at Police Station Udhyog Vihar, Gurugram.
2. Vide order dated 02.12.2024, while granting interim protection, the petitioners were directed to join investigation.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that in

pursuance to the order passed by this Court, petitioners have joined the investigation and as such their interim bail may be made absolute.

4. However, learned counsel for the complainant has opposed the prayer and submits that though it was a commercial transaction but the petitioners have forged the invoices and thus, have caused huge loss to the complainant.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioners has drawn the attention of this Court to the status report already filed by the State and submits that the arbitration proceedings are also pending between the parties. It is, thus, submitted that the dispute in the present case is totally of civil nature which has been intentionally given a colour of criminal case.

6. Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI, Rajinder has affirmed the submissions made by the learned counsel for the petitioners and stated that petitioners have joined the investigation and they are no more required for further investigation.

7. In view of the above, interim order dated 02.12.2024 is made absolute subject to compliance of conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023. Petition stands allowed.
