SANJAY VASHISTH, J.

1. Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 482 of the BNSS, 2023 (earlier Section 438 Cr.P.C.), is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner, who has been booked in a criminal case arising out of First Information Report, as detailed hereunder:-

2. On 03.02.2025, following order was passed:-

“Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 482 of the BNSS, 2023 (earlier Section 438 Cr.P.C.), is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner, who has been booked in a criminal case arising out of First Information Report, as detailed hereunder:-

2. *Learned counsel for the petitioner, inter alia, contends that the petitioner is not a history-sheeter, and most probably, allegations of pelting stones at the door of the house of the complainant, have been levelled against the petitioner due to minor scuffle, which in fact, took place in market in recent past.*

Counsel for the petitioner also submits that the petitioner as well as the complainant are the residents of the same locality/city, and therefore, he would be ready to resolve the dispute amicably also.

3. *He also submits that on his oral request, complainant namely Sukhdev s/o Shri Chandrapal alias Chandra Bhan, t/o Ward No.3, Gupta Colony, Tohana, District Fatehabad, be impleaded as respondent No.2 in the present petition.*

4. *Request made by counsel for the petitioner, is accepted, and Sukhdev is ordered to be impleaded as respondent No.2 in the present petition. Let amended memo of parties be placed on record, within a period of two days from today, in the Registry.*

5. *Notice of motion.*

6. *On advance notice, Mr. Kanwar Sanjiv Kumar, AAG, Haryana, puts in appearance on behalf of respondent No.1.*

Let respondent No.2 be served through SHO i.e. respondent No.1 for 07.04.2025.

Let the petitioner and respondent No.2 remain present before this Court, on the next date of hearing.

7. *In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation as and when required to do so by the Investigating Agency. In the event of his arrest, the petitioner shall be released on ad-interim bail, subject to his furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer. The petitioner shall also be abide by all the conditions laid down under Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023 (earlier Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.).*

8. *Besides, the petitioner would submit/surrender his passport before the Arresting Officer and an undertaking on oath that in case of leaving the Country, he would seek prior permission from the Investigating Agency/concerned Court.”*

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that in compliance of the order dated 03.02.2025, passed by this Court, the petitioner has joined the investigation, and has fully co-operated.

4. Learned State counsel on instructions from PSI Pardeep Kumar, confirms the said averment and submits that the custodial interrogation of the petitioner would not be required now for the purpose of investigation.

5. Heard learned counsel for the parties.

6. Since the petitioner has joined the investigation and custodial interrogation is no more required, present petition is allowed and interim order dated 03.02.2025, passed by this Court is hereby made absolute.

However, petitioner shall continue to join the investigation as and when required to do so and abide by all the terms and conditions laid down under Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023.

Besides, it is directed that petitioner would hand over his passport to the Investigating Agency or to Court concerned, if he possesses. Otherwise, would submit an affidavit, disclosing the fact that he does not possess any passport.

It is also directed that before leaving country any time during trial, petitioner would seek prior permission of the Court.

7. Accordingly, petition stands disposed of.
