The present contempt petition has been filed alleging wilful disobedience of the order dated 21.01.2019 passed by this Court in CWP No.1565 of 2019.

The operational part of the order is reproduced below:-

“ In view of the short grievance portrayed, I deem it appropriate to dispose of the instant petition without even ascertaining the correctness of the averments made in the petition with a direction to respondent no.4 i.e. the Executive Engineer, Water Supply and Sanitation Division, Mallout, District Sri Muktsar Sahib to examine the claim of the petitioner in the light of the representation dated 9.11.2018 (Annexure P-3) i.e. stated to have already been submitted and to take a final decision thereupon expeditiously and in any case within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

Needless to observe that in case any amount is found due, the same would be released to the petitioner-firm without any further delay.

Disposed of.”

Learned State counsel submits that one last opportunity be granted to comply with the order dated 21.01.2019. He assures that needful shall be done within eight weeks from today.

At this stage, the contempt petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.4 to do the needful within eight weeks from today.

In case of failure to comply with the order, the petitioner would be at liberty to revive the contempt petition which shall be at the cost and responsibility of the defaulting official.
