Prayer in this petition is for initiation of contempt proceedings against the respondent for not complying the order dated 02.12.2024 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-32438-2024 titled as “Bholu Kumar @ Bholu Ram vs. State of Punjab and others” vide which the petition was disposed of with a direction to the respondent “...to consider and decide the claim made by the petitioner in legal notice dated 15.10.2024 (Annexure P-2) in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. In case, the petitioner is found entitled, necessary benefits be released within a period of three weeks thereafter.”



Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the payment has been made to the petitioner, however, after delay of several months.

Learned counsel for the respondent informs that a Speaking Order was passed on 31.12.2024 and the last payment stood released to the petitioner in August 2025. It is submitted that some delay in making the payment took place in the process of releasing the benefits due to the petitioner; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

In view of the facts noted above, no further orders are required to be passed in the present petition, the same is **disposed of** accordingly.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
