By way of this petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, petitioner prays for issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to re-fix his salary by setting aside the impugned order passed by respondent No.2 for re-fixation of salary wrongly made on 05.07.2024 (Annexure P.3) and to return the amount of ₹1,02,560/- illegally taken on the pretext of recovery. Petitioner further submits that he had sent a legal notice dated 21.10.2024 (Annexure P.6) for redressal of his grievances but no action has been taken thereupon.

2. Learned counsel also submits that the petitioner will be satisfied in case the respondents are directed to take a decision on the legal notice dated 21.10.2024 (Annexure P.6) by passing a speaking order.

3. Notice of motion.

4. Ms. Harpriya, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents-PSPCL. She has no objection to the prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have gone through the record of the case.

6. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case or the claim being made by the petitioner in the present petition, respondents are directed to



consider the grievances put forth by the petitioner in legal notice dated 21.10.2024 (Annexure P.6), in accordance with law, by passing a speaking order within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

7. The petition stands disposed of.
