1. Petitioner is seeking quashing of order dated 21.05.2025 passed by the Court of learned Additional Sessions Judge, Ludhiana in case arising out of FIR No.11, dated 26.01.2023, under Sections 379-B, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station Division No.4, District Ludhiana, whereby his bail was cancelled and on account of his non-appearance, his bonds were forfeited to the State, non-bailable warrants were ordered to be issued against him for 29.07.2025 and now the fresh non-bailable warrants have been ordered to be issued against the petitioner for 22.09.2025.

2. It is argued by learned counsel for the petitioner that he had been regularly appearing before the learned trial court but could not appear before the trial Court only on 21.05.2025 on account of the fact that he was a drug addict and was under treatment in a drug addiction centre. He had been advised bed rest and due to impact of the medicine used for the treatment, he used to sleep for the whole day and it was due to that reason, he could not

appear before the trial Court. He is ready to abide by the terms and conditions to be imposed upon him and is willing to join the proceedings. It is, therefore, urged that the impugned order be quashed.

3. Notice of motion.

4. On the asking of the Court, Ms. Sakshi Bakshi, learned AAG, Punjab accepts notice and submits that keeping in view the act and conduct of the petitioner, the petition does not deserve to be allowed.

5. I have heard rival submissions made by learned counsel for the parties.

6. Perusal of the impugned order reveals that the bail of the petitioner has been cancelled on account of his non-appearance. Though there is no illegality or infirmity in the impugned order, however, keeping in view the fact that the petitioner is now ready and willing to join the proceedings before the trial Court and his non-appearance does not appear to be intentional, the instant petition is disposed of by directing the petitioner to surrender before the trial Court on or before the date already fixed and furnish fresh personal as well as surety bonds to its satisfaction.

7. Disposed of.
