1. By way of present petition filed under Sections 10 & 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, read with Article 215 of the Constitution of India, contempt proceedings are sought to be initiated against the respondents towards alleged willful non-compliance of order dated 31.01.2020 passed by this Court in CWP No.26894 of 2016.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance of the detailed order passed by this Court on 09.09.2024 in COCP No.2686 of 2020, the respondents have accepted the grant of consequential benefits in favour of the petitioner in furtherance to their regularization, though the actual disbursement is awaited.

3. In response, learned counsel representing the respondents submits that the needful shall be done within a period of three weeks from today.

4. In view of aforesaid statement made by the respondents, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press the present petition.

5. Dismissed as not pressed. Rule stands discharged.

6. However, in case the needful is not done within the aforementioned period, as per the undertaking, the petitioner would be at liberty to seek revival of contempt petition and in that eventuality, the erring/concerned officer would be liable to pay a sum of Rs.1,00,000/- as cost(s) from his/her own pocket in favour of the petitioner towards litigation expenses, immediately i.e. on the first date of listing of revival application.
